## How you book your camp site is changing

From February 2012, all camping in national park and resource reserve camping areas on Cape York Peninsula will need to be pre-booked. Self-registration will no longer be available.

Campers will need to purchase an e-permit before arriving at the camping area. This change ensures e-permit holders of a camp site upon their arrival at the camping area.

## Be crocwise in croc country



Crocodiles live in the rivers and creeks, swamps, wetlands and waterholes, along the coast and offshore of Cape York Peninsula. Remember:

- Don't be ambushed—stay out of the water and away from the water's edge.
- Watch children closely.
- Camp as far from the water as possible.
- Don't leave food scraps or fish waste around.
